The @MACAULAY AUTHOR SERIES Presents Feminist Icon Letty Cottin Pogrebin and Her New Book *Single Jewish Male Seeking Soul Mate*

Essayist, Novelist and Law Professor Thane Rosenbaum Will Interview the Author

(September 16, 2015, New York, NY) – The @MACAULAY AUTHOR SERIES presents journalist, feminist and lecturer Letty Cottin Pogrebin with her new book ***Single Jewish Male Seeking Soul Mate*** on October 14, 2015. Pogrebin's book tells a New York love story complicated by the historical tensions between American Jews and African Americans. In it, Zach Levy, son of Holocaust survivors, promises his mother on her deathbed to marry within the faith, only eventually to fall in love with Cleo Scott, an African American activist. The novel explores what happens when the heart runs counter to politics, history, and the compelling weight of tradition. Pogrebin will read from her novel, followed by a conversation with American novelist, essayist, and law professor **Thane Rosenbaum**, and an audience Q&A.

The October 14th event, which is free and open to the public, begins at 7pm at Macaulay Honors College, 35 West 67th Street (between Central Park West and Columbus). Following the talk, there will be a book signing and informal reception. Books will be available for purchase.
